Open Enrollment Recap

- Open Enrollment (OE) was held Oct. 15-31, 2020
- All Non-Medicare members were moved to the 70/30 Plan and needed to take action to enroll in the 80/20 Plan or to reduce their premium.
 - Subscribers in the Retirement System did not have to complete the tobacco attestation for the 70/30 Plan, as it will remain premium-free for eligible retirees and disabled members.
- As a reminder, all Medicare Advantage members are transitioning to Humana as of Jan. 1, 2021.
 - UHC Medicare Advantage members were moved to the Humana Medicare Advantage Base Plan and needed to take action during OE if they wanted to be on the Enhanced Medicare Advantage Plan.

Communication Outreach Summary

- The Customer Experience Team reached a total of 30,270 members through webinars and Telephone Town Halls prior to and during Open Enrollment.
- The team also reached **604** Health Benefit Representatives through training webinars.




2021 Open Enrollment Results: Non-Med Prime

- What happens to Non-Medicare primary subscribers who did not take action during Open Enrollment?
 - Active Subscribers will be enrolled in the 70/30 Plan for 2021.
 - They have missed the opportunity to:
 - Elect the 80/20 Plan
 - Drop coverage for themselves
 - Add or drop dependents
 - Reduce their premium by \$60 per month by completing the tobacco attestation
 - Non-Medicare Primary Subscribers in the Retirement System will also be enrolled in the 70/30 Plan for 2021.
 - While they are not impacted by the tobacco attestation or the inability to drop coverage, they also missed opportunity to:
 - o Elect the 80/20 Plan
 - Add dependents



Tobacco Attestation Completion Rate (Active Members)






2021 Open Enrollment Results: Active Employees

Active employees are the most impacted if they do not complete OE.
 Fortunately, 94% (292,902) of our Active employees completed Open Enrollment.




2021 Open Enrollment Results: Medicare Primary

- Medicare Primary members may have a second opportunity to make changes.
- Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period will run from Jan. 1 March 31, 2021.
 - Plan members enrolled in a Medicare Advantage Plan will be able to make one change during this period.
 - Plan members enrolled in the 70/30 Plan will not be able to change plans.



Open Enrollment Results: Medicare Primary Plan Selections



- 192,083 Medicare members
- Counts are based on the last day of Open Enrollment.
- Since the end of OE, more than 2,000 Medicare members have been disenrolled and moved to the 70/20 Plan as a result of the bump against CMS records.
- The final enrollment results will not be available until the end of the Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period.



Eligibility and Enrollment Support Center

- The Plan's Eligibility and Enrollment Support Center offered extended call center hours throughout OE.
- Extended hours included:
 - Monday-Friday, 8am-10pm
 - Saturday, 8am-5pm

2021 Open Enrollment Results

- Open Enrollment by all accounts was successful.
- 334,913 out of 356,815 subscribers took action during OE, which means 94% of our subscribers took action! Last year, 325,921 subscribers took action.
 - 44,657 subscribers successfully completed enrollment activity by phone (13% of total).
 - An additional 39,153 subscribers called for a variety of other reasons such as password resets, navigational assistance or benefits/premium information.

A Deeper Look at the Numbers

- Between January 2020 and January 2021, the Plan has seen an overall increase of 7,342 members, which is mainly due to Open Enrollment.
- The active population has decreased by 1,523 from January 2020.
- Members in the Retirement Systems have increased by 8,607.
 - The Plan added 1,928 subscribers and 2,548 dependents in the Retirement Systems during or after Open Enrollment.
- The Medicare Advantage Plans added 2,646 new dependents and 1,162 subscribers through Open Enrollment.
 - 1,200 additional Medicare members were added to the 70/30 Plan.
 - This is most likely due to getting disenrolled as a result being enrolled in another MA plan.
